



From whitewater kayaking in the Pamirs to confronting whalers in Antarctica and capturing haunting footage in Taiji, Peter Heller has lived—and written—on the edge. A contributor to NPR and former editor at top adventure mags, Heller is also a bestselling novelist whose thrillers and memoirs blend wild landscapes, deep emotion, and high-stakes action. Dive into the life of a man who's surfed, paddled, and fought his way around the globe—then wrote it all down. With fluid language and pictographic natural descriptions, readers race through his exploits. Gifted with humor and experience, Heller is in demand as a speaker as well as a writer.


Patrick and PJ Anderson:

"It's got a little bit of everything," Anderson said about their book,

Cheyenne Mountain: Here's Looking at You.

P.J. Anderson crystallized his years as a county planning attorney and outdoorsman in an enlightening history of our second-most famous regional attraction, *Cheyenne Mountain: Here's Looking at You*, which has earned the Golden Quill Award. It's got geology (Cheyenne Mountain's rock is thought to be 600 million years older than Pikes Peak's). It's got legends (the one about the dragon). It's got tales of expeditions (Pike's, Long's and Fremont's), and accounts of plane crashes and fires (the "Big Burn" of 1853 was said to stretch all the way to Wilkerson Pass).

Although overshadowed by the famous peak further west, Cheyenne Mountain is significantly older in its geology and has provided homesteaders, hotel builders, NORAD, and today's residents with national security, broadcasting tech, and challenging hiking. Patrick Anderson's work to rebuild some of those trails, as well as his efforts tracing those that have disappeared with his father, indicates the sturdy requirements needed, even today, to hike the mountain. The 9-year process to transition the JL Ranch, owned by descendants of the first homesteaders Myra and Bert Swisher, into our only state park in El Paso County is also noteworthy.



Did you know...

- Three Peaks: Cheyenne Mountain comprises three distinct peaks: the southern summit, formerly known as Mount Albrecht, stands at 9,200 feet; the middle peak hosts an antenna farm; and the northern peak, known as "The Horns," resembles a dragon's head or horns, according to Native American legends.
- EMP Protection: The complex is the only underground Department of Defense facility certified to withstand a high-altitude electromagnetic pulse (EMP).
- Annual Santa Tracker: NORAD, based at Cheyenne Mountain, has been tracking Santa Claus's Christmas Eve journey since 1955, delighting children worldwide.
- WarGames (1983): The film features a fictionalized version of the command center, codenamed "Crystal Palace."


