# Membership updates:

We are thrilled to announce important updates regarding streamlined membership fees and processing structure for the Friends of the Pikes Peak Library District that will take effect on January 1, 2025.

As our organization continues to grow and evolve, it has become necessary to adjust our membership fees to better support our programs and initiatives. After careful consideration, we have established a new fee structure that aims to make membership more accessible while ensuring the sustainability of our activities.

Our new membership levels are based on a household. A household is an individual or a family consisting of up to two adults and any number of dependent children in the household up to 18 years of age.

Memberships include:

- **Bronze** Membership (\$25): discounts at all Friends bookstores, early entry and discounts at the semi annual big book sales, invitations to special events, quarterly newsletters and support for free and public library services and resources.
- Silver Membership (\$200): includes all the bronze level incentives plus one Literary Award admittance (a \$60 value) and a \$15 gift certificate one of our semi-annual book sales.
- **Gold** Membership (\$400): includes all the bronze level incentives plus two admittances to the Literary Awards (a \$120 value,) a \$25 gift certificate to one of our semi-annual book sales, plus a gift to show our appreciation.

As noted above, we are consolidating levels and offering one

simple household membership (Bronze) for \$25 yearly. This membership will be good for a household, defined as an individual or a family, of up to two adults and any number of dependent children up to the age of 18. For example, if you are coming to our big book sale and your spouse or partner decides to join you - no problem. You will also no longer need to upgrade to a family membership when your child turns 12.

# For those of you with our grandfathered Lifetime Memberships - no worries. You will continue to enjoy all the benefits of Friends membership.

Additionally, we are working on a web-based system that will simplify enrolling and maintaining your Friends' membership. With the new system, you can enroll/renew online and print a card instantly or show your card from your smart phone as you stand inline at the big book sale. For those of you who don't have smart phones and will need a card mailed, don't worry – we can accommodate you! We hope to have that system rolled out before our next Big Book Sale in March.

We understand that changes in fees can be challenging, and we are committed to providing support to anyone who may have concerns. If you have any questions, feel free to reach out to the <u>Friends email</u>.

These changes will help us enhance our offerings and provide even more value to our members. We thank you for your understanding and continued support. Together, we can ensure the Friends of Pikes Peak Library District thrives for years to come.
