






Labor Day in the United States, celebrated on the first Monday in September, began in the late 19th century as a tribute to the contributions and achievements of American workers. The holiday grew out of the labor movement's push for better working conditions, fair wages, and reasonable hours during the Industrial Revolution. The first Labor Day parade was held in New York City in 1882, organized by labor unions to showcase workers' solidarity and strength. In 1894, following a period of nationwide labor unrest, Congress officially declared Labor Day a national holiday, honoring the vital role of workers in building the nation's prosperity.



#### JOHN SPEARS

**★** 1973 - 2025

A dedicated leader whose warm smile and presence spoke volumes about his commitment to community and knowledge.



The former CEO and Chief Librarian of the Pikes Peak Library District, John Spears, has passed away at age 51 from cancer. John, who led the local library district to national and international prominence, was most recently director of the Buffalo and Erie County Public Library System in New York.

Spears will be best remembered for advocating to protect intellectual freedoms, a staunch advocate for Amendment 2 rights, and for promoting adequate funding for libraries. Spears clocked more than 25 years of library management experience in Missouri, Illinois, and Utah before coming to Colorado Springs. While here, he was known for fostering relationships with all sectors of the community and other libraries. He advocated for library funding and resources through speaking engagements and published articles for the Western New York Library Resources Council, New York Library Association, American Library Association, Library Leadership and Management Association, the International Federation of Library Associations, and Public Libraries Magazine.

He was an appreciative advocate for the Friends of the Pikes Peak Library District, often attending our meetings and events. He was funny and passionate and a communicator who will be missed by all who knew him.
